


Mauro Cazzolla

Conference Paper Acceptance

Congratulations to Jacob for having their paper "Print and Propaganda: Representations of socialism, anarchism, and feminism in 1890s Argentine press" accepted for presentation at the 2023 English Graduate Student Organization Conference on Reciprocity at Cornell University. The paper examines La voz de la mujer, an anarcho-communist feminist journal published in the mid-1890s by Virginia Bolten in the Rio de la Plata region. Despite the short duration of the publication, La Voz de la Mujer was a unique and radical journal in that it proclaimed a particular type of feminism unprecedented at its time in Latin America where feminist discourse was dominated by educated middle-class women and men. They develop this idea within the historical context of the Argentine state's formation and the construction of its national population in order to consider the limits of who constituted the working class (women) and the limits of the alliances between such groups within the radical movements germinating in this moment.



<u>Interview</u>

The Basque Summer University (Udako Euskal Unibertsitatea, UEU) interviewed Eukene for her recent work with Basque heritage speakers in the USA, and for her experience as a Basque grad student at the University of Miami. It says "for Basque-speaking Basque-Americans, it is not compulsory to know Basque to self-identify as Basque or to participate in the Basque-American community." Find the interview here.

Eukene also completed a research stay in Boise, Idaho, during Spring Break, where she interviewed Basque-Americans about their struggles in their dual identity and language ideologies about nativeness and heritage speakerism.

It is a volume that contains a collection of papers by his colleagues of Basque linguistics, and more importantly, by his former students (who are now professors in the USA). She participated with a (very humble) paper called "Argumentuen komunztadura aldakortasuna hizkuntzetan zehar" [Argument agreement variation across languages]. 

She will receive 140 contact hours of intensive instruction spread over six weeks. This fellowship is funded by the U.S. Department of Education.

Conference Presentations

Luli presented her essay titled: "Indigenous Women of the Ecuadorian Amazon: the first line of Defense of their territory," where she analyzes how Amazonian women of Ecuador are creating new venues to advocate for their communities, resist extractive oil industries, and reclaim their territories the NAGIS Conference held at the University of Miami from April 24-25, 2023. This essay focuses on Amazonian women's activism and the obstacles they face in navigating spaces where male presence prevails. As such, this essay pays particular attention to Indigenous women's interactions with the government, NGOs, and members of their communities.

Luli will be presenting her essay: "La representación del cuerpo violentado en Cuerpo presente de *Siomara España*" was accepted as part of the panel: Nación y colapso: discursos y representaciones del Ecuador en ficciones literarias y audiovisuales into the Track: Literature Studies for the LASA2023 Hybrid Congress: América Latina y el Caribe: Pensar, Representar y Luchar por los Derechos taking place May 24–27, 2023, virtually and on-site in Vancouver, Canada.
